First Aid Checklist

Ш	3% Hydrogen Peroxide
	Never administer to induce vomiting before consulting a veterinarian or a
\Box	poison control center. Do not treat wounds with hydrogen peroxide.
Ш	Adhesive Medical Tape Secure gauze or bandages. Do not apply adhesive materials to fur.
\Box	Clean Towels
٦	Restrain, muzzle, or transport injured animals. Clean, protect, or pad wounds & injuries.
	Digital Thermometer Normal temperature for dogs and cats is 100-102.5° F.
	Emergency Contact Information
_	Be prepared with info for your vet, nearest emergency clinic, Poison Control, & local police/fire departments and Animal Control.
	Exam Gloves
_	Prevent cross-contamination between you and your pet while administering first aid.
	Eye Dropper or Oral Syringe (without a needle)
_	Use to flush wounds or administer fluid medications.
Ц	Gauze Rolls and Gauze Pads
_	Use rolled gauze to wrap wounds or muzzle an injured animal.
Ш	Hand Sanitizer Gel or Wipes
\Box	Clean hands before and after treating a wound—do not use on your pet.
Ш	Instant Cold Pack Reduce swelling and inflammation after a bee or wasp sting, sprain/strain, or bruising.
	Do not apply directly to skin. Do not use cold packs to cool an over-heated pet.
	K-Y Jelly or Surgilube in single-use packets
_	Use water-based lubricant to protect wounds or eyes or to lubricate a thermometer.
	Milk of Magnesia or Activated Charcoal
_	Never administer to absorb poison unless instructed by a vet or a poison control
	center. Never administer to a pet who is vomiting, having seizures, or unconscious.
	Muzzle Never use a muzzle on an animal who is vomiting.
	Non-adhesive Bandages
_	Control bleeding and protect wounds. Use to muzzle an injured animal.
	Pet's Medical Record
_	Saline Solution Use to rinse wounds or eyes.
	Scissors Cut bandages and tape. Trim fur surrounding wounds, if necessary.
	Sealed Bottled Water
_	Cleanse wounds, rinse burns, cool overheated pets by wrapping in wet towels, rehydrate.
	Self-adhering Medical Wrap (Vet Wrap) Secure gauze or bandages.
	Spare Leash & Collar and/or Location of Pet Carrier
	Styptic Powder Quickly slows bleeding from minor cuts.
_	Supply of Pet's Chronic Meds Check expiration dates before administering.
	Tick Comb or Tick Removal Tool
_	Triple Antibiotic Ointment in single-use packets
_	Protect wounds before handaging
